Cocoricò Tapes tells the story told through the unpublished images of those years and through the words of the people who made those radical nights possible. Invisible Beauty traces Hardison's impact from runway shows in the 1970s to today's corporate board rooms.

A moving eco-fable by the acclaimed Japanese director Ryusuke Hamaguchi (Best International Feature Film Academy Award for Drive My Car), winner of four major prizes at the 2023 Venice Film Festival, including a Grand Jury Prize.

A desperate boxing coach pushes his son to become the champion he could never be - until one fateful night, a gut-wrenching discovery throws his whole world into turmoil - while the truth about his past finally catches up with him. Set in regional Queensland, Heart of the Man is an authentic depiction of the struggle between familial and social expectation and what you really love, and who you are as a human being. Director David Cook and Actor Parker Little will be in attendance to introduce the film.

Theatre of Thought

Directed by Werner Herzog | USA | 2022 | 107 min | PG

Through the lens of legendary filmmaker Werner Herzog, Theatre of Thought takes us on a provocative journey into the study of the mind and consciousness, daring us to question whether we truly have autonomy over our thoughts, or if our brains will inevitably become infused with mind-controlling technology in the not so distant future.

Directed by Christian Petzold | Germany | 2023 | 102 min | M

Friends Leon (Thomas Schubert) and Felix (Langston Uibel) head to an idyllic seaside home for the summer. They look forward to relaxation, but also must focus on their creative projects. Gorgeously staged and directed by Christian Petzold (Barbara, Phoenix, Undine), this tragicomic story of friendship, artistic pursuit and the complexity of human interaction was awarded with a Grand Jury Prize at the 2023 Berlin Film Festival.

Eskawatã Kayawai - The Spirit of Transformation

Directed by Lara Jacoski & Patrick Belem | Brazil | 2023 | 72 min | M

In the heart of the Amazon rainforest the First Nation Huni Kuin are experiencing the renaissance of their identity, after decades of slavery and being forbidden to live their culture. The spirit of Transformation shows the profound connection that the Huni Kuin people have with Ayahuasca and how its integration into their rituals led to the rediscovery of their culture.

Freud's Last Session

Directed by Matthew Brown | USA | 2023 | 122 min | M

London, 1939. On the eve of the Second World War the father of psychoanalysis, Sigmund Freud (Anthony Hopkins), host Oxford don and committed Christian C.S. Lewis (Matthew Goode) at his Hampstead home for a debate over the existence of God.

Big Wave Guardians Directed by Luke Stirtz | USA | 2022 | 90 min | PG

Hawaii's North Shore is the world's most dangerous seven-mile stretch of beach. Massive swells, life-and-death rescues, and "the best job in the world" - yet often the most hazardous one – is the compelling drama of Hawaii's big wave guardians.
